



## CROSS RIVER STATE OF NIGERIA

LAW NO. 2 (2019)

*\*A Law to appropriate out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the services of the Government of Cross River State of Nigeria for the year ending on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December, 2019, the sum of Sixty-Eight Billion, Eight Hundred and Eighty-Five Million, Fourteen Thousand, Five Hundred and Forty-Seven Naira, Eleven Kobo aforesaid, and to authorize out of the Capital Development Fund, the sum of One Trillion, Forty-Four Billion, Two Hundred and Fourteen Million, Three Hundred and Thirty-Four Thousand, Forty-Three Naira, Ninety-Three Kobo; and for matters connected therewith.*

Commencement.

**The Cross River State House of Assembly enacts as follows –**

Enactment.

1. The Accountant-General of Cross River State of Nigeria may, when authorized so to do by Warrants issued by the Governor, pay out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the State during the year ending on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December, 2019 the sums specified by the Warrants, not exceeding in the aggregate Sixty-Eight Billion, Eight Hundred and Eighty-Five Million, Fourteen Thousand, Five Hundred and Forty-Seven Naira, Eleven Kobo being the total of the amount set out opposite the Heads of Expenditure in Schedule 1 and may for the like period and in like manner pay out of the Capital Development Fund the sum specified by warrants not exceeding in the aggregate One Trillion, Forty-Four Billion, Two Hundred and Fourteen Million, Three Hundred and Thirty-Four Thousand, Forty-Three Naira, Ninety-Three Kobo being the total of the amounts set out opposite the Heads of Expenditure in Schedule 2 hereto.

2. The said sums, not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of One Trillion, One Hundred and Thirteen Billion, Ninety-Nine Million, Three Hundred and Forty-Eight Thousand, Five Hundred and Ninety-One Naira, Four Kobo shall be appropriated for the purposes and in the manner expressed in the relevant Schedules.

3. The said sum does not include Statutory Votes of Thirty-Five Billion, Four Hundred and Twenty-Eight Million, Six Hundred and Eighty-Five Thousand, Six Hundred and Seventy Naira, Twenty-Nine Kobo being the Votes so extracted from the Heads of Expenditure set out in Schedule 3 hereto.

4. No part of the amount mentioned in Section 2 of this Law shall be issued out of the respective funds after the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December, 2019.

Prohibition of issue after  
31<sup>st</sup> December, 2019.

5. (1) The power to issue Warrants for the purpose of this Law shall be deemed to have been delegated by the State Governor to the Commissioner for Finance.

Delegation of the power  
to Issue Warrants.

(2) Notwithstanding the delegation under sub-section (1) of this Section, the State Governor may himself exercise the power to issue Warrants under this Law.

6. This Law may be cited as the Cross River State Appropriation Law 2019, and shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January, 2019.
